

# February's Birthstone: Amethyst

Amethyst is the official birthstone for February as adopted by the American National Association of Jewelers in 1912. It is also the birth stone for the Zodiac sign of Pisces. Amethyst is the purple variety of quartz and the

most valued member of the quartz family. It must be purple to be amethyst, but it can display a range of shades including deep purple, light lilac, lavender and mauve. Top quality amethyst is a deep medium purple with rose-colored flashes. Its purple color made it a stone of royalty for many thousands of years. Amethyst can occur as crystals that are six sided on either end. It also forms as drusy which are crystalline crusts covering the host rock. It is found inside geodes and in alluvial deposits all around the world and occurs in both crystalline and massive forms. The amount of iron contained in the specimen accounts for the depth of purple. Throughout history amethyst has been used to guard against drunkenness and is thought to be helpful in overcoming addiction. It has been used for hearing disorders. insomnia, headaches and other pain. Some sources suggest it is used to stabilize mental disorders.

Amethyst is worn to make the wearer gentle and amiable. Other powers attributed to amethyst include: dreams, healing, peace, love, spiritual upliftment, courage, psychism, protection against thieves, and happiness.



Amethyst location and deposits: The most important deposits are in Brazil, namely the "Palmeira" amethysts of Rio Grande do Sul and the "Maraba" amethysts of Para. Other deposits are found in Bolivia, Canada, India, Madagascar, Mexico, Myanmar (Burma), Namibia, Russia, Sri Lanka, United States (Arizona), Uruguay and Zambia.

Amethyst is found in many collections of gem and mineral collectors. Many people really love the Brazilian "Cathedrals" and recent US workings are from Jackson Crossroads in Georgia. Look at them, see the links below!!



## **Tumbling "Oops"**

The vibrating tumbler instructions were quite clear. If the stones are wet, add 2 tablespoons of water, if the stones are dry, add 3 tablespoons of water. Then add the grit or polish, and let run for 24 to 48 hours, and do not let the tumbler run dry. I do not have a measuring spoon out by the tumbler, but never had a problem. I had a batch of stones ready for final polish, so I added the polishing compound and a "splash" of water. 24 hours later it was bitterly cold so I decided to let them run for another 24 hours. The following day I did not get home from work until 10:00 PM so I decided it was OK to let them run a day longer. At 72 hours it was still really cold with promises of being warmer on the following day. It was just polish, so I decided it was OK to let them run for another day. So there I was, about 96 hours later. I looked at the tumbler as it ran and saw that it looked dry, but it was just polish so it should be OK. I looked at the stones and I could

see the polish stuck to the stones, but as the next step was a couple of hours with very mild detergent I figured it would be OK. Obviously I had too many OK's – when they came out of the final detergent bath and were rinsed very well, ALL WAS NOT WELL! The tumbler polish had been hammered into all the little holes and cracks and also adhered to any rough areas. Gentle wiping did remove the polish. Scrubbing did not remove the polish. An alcohol wipe did not remove the polish. YES - YOU DO NOT WANT TO LET THE TUMBLER RUN DRY. These stones are back in the tumbler having just finished the rough grind. Lesson Learned.

The Federation's next annual meeting will be held on August 17, 2013.


#### **ANNUAL SILENT AUCTION**
