Minutes – February, 2007 General Meeting

5. Del Grady will be preparing a proposal for the *Beginner’s Faceting Class*.

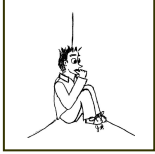
New Business

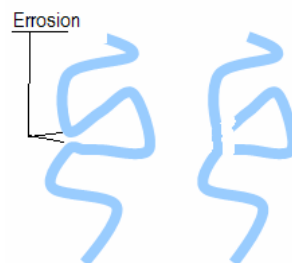
Question of the Month: What is an Oxbow Lake?

An Oxbow Lake, as defined in *The Roadside Geology of Texas*, is “the abandoned, water-filled loop of a stream meander that looks like a U-shaped ox yoke. If you have ever flown over the Mississippi River you have probably seen dozens of oxbow lakes. If you have never seen an oxbow lake, you should check out Google Earth (you can download a free version of Google Earth form <http://earth.google.com/>), zoom in on an area of the Mississippi or any large meandering river and you can’t miss finding one. The meandering river aspect is an important factor. A fast flowing river flowing through mountainous areas is not likely to form an oxbow lake. A slow river wandering over relatively flat terrain will likely form oxbow lakes.

An oxbow lake is formed by the natural meandering phenomena of a river. As the river turns, the outside of a turn is eroded while the lit is deposited on the inside of the river bend. As indicated in the drawing, the erosion is about to cut through the narrow section of land remaining in the left hand figure. In the right hand figure, the river has cut through to form a new channel, and silt has filled in the area between the river and the cut off section forming an oxbow lake. As the river floods during the rainy season, silt is slowly deposited in the oxbow lake, gradually filling it. Eventually, the oxbow lake will be completely filled in, but is often still recognizable as being the remains of an oxbow lake.



As a rockhound, would you care about an oxbow lake? If you were looking for stones or minerals, you would normally look on the inside of a river bend. I suppose the same would apply to an oxbow lake, look on what had been the inside of the river bend. I have never tried this, just speculating. I do know, however, that I found some interesting pieces of Jasper and Agate on the inside of the Green River in Utah. The Green River, where I was looking, was flowing through rather mountainous territory and was a fast flowing river, but even the Mississippi must have a good current during the flood season.

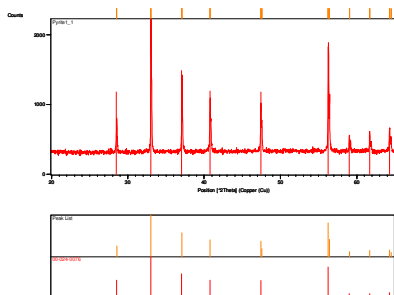
Midlothian Texas Pyrite Identification and Trivia

Many people have referred to the Midlothian, TX Pyrite Crystals as Pyrite, Marcasite or a combination of both. I thought that it would be interesting to see what the crystals were really made of. The chart below is an X-ray Diffraction (XRD) scan of a Midlothian Pyrite Crystal. The scan shows the sample to be pure pyrite. The error of this test is + or - 1%; so, the pyrite is at least 99% pure pyrite with possible minor traces of other compounds.

The possibility of a trace of marcasite would be an explanation as to why the pyrite is not shiny or is tarnished. Pyrite and marcasite are chemically identical both are made of iron disulfide (FeS₂). The crystal formation is different. This is why XRD is a powerful tool for crystal identification. The density of each is also different. Pyrite is heavier with a specific gravity of 5.0-5.2. Marcasite is lighter with a specific gravity of 4.8 - 4.9.

The layer that they are found in also contains teeth and marine fossilized. This layer has been dated and is between 65 and 135 million years old.

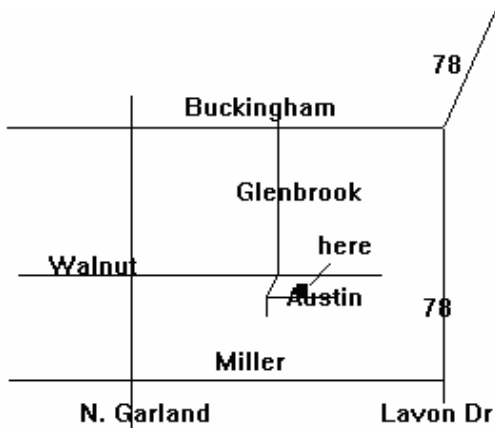

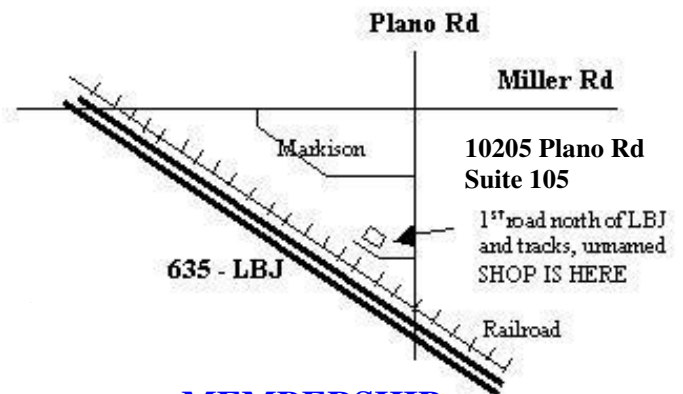
